Betsey holds a masters degree in Urban Education from Simmons College in Boston and a Ph.D. in Sport Psychology and Health Promotion from the University of Virginia.



Amanda Robertson is co-founder and board chair of a non-profit company, Pittsboro Matters, Inc., which supports a sustainable local community. Pittsboro Matters' current project focuses on improving the Chatham Park development in Pittsboro, which will be the largest planned development in the history of the state.

Amanda is a committee member on the Chatham County Climate Change Advisory Committee, and is a leader and lecturer in the Climate Reality Leadership Program and a volunteer for Citizen's Climate Lobby.

Her full time occupation is as cofounder and CEO of The Farthest Pixel, an educational media design firm that focuses on design solutions that leverages rich media to broaden the scope of online learning. This company offers education and training in sustainable business practices and CSR.
